Dear Processors,

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) is a disease that affects the central nervous system of deer, elk, moose, and other members of the cervid family. It is always fatal to the animal. Once introduced eradication of the disease from the area may be impossible.

In an effort to protect deer populations in North Dakota, the North Dakota Game & Fish Department would like to remind you of the following restrictions that may affect your operation:

It shall be unlawful to transport into or within North Dakota the whole carcass or carcass parts of white-tailed deer, mule deer, moose, elk, from deer hunting unit 3F2 in North Dakota and states, countries, or provinces with documented occurrences of CWD in wild populations or farmed cervids, except for the following portions of the carcass:

- Quarters or other portions of meat with no part of the spinal column or head attached.
- · Meat that has been boned out.
- Meat that is cut and wrapped either commercially or privately.
- Hides with no heads attached.
- Clean (no meat or tissue attached) skull plates with antlers attached.
- Antlers with no meat or tissue attached.
- Upper canine teeth, also known as "buglers", "whistlers", or "ivories".
- Finished taxidermy heads.

Only the above exceptions apply and no whole carcasses of these animals may be transported into the State of North Dakota. No whole deer carcasses may be transported within North Dakota from deer hunting unit 3F2.
